
TOP TIPS TO HELP PREVENT IMMIGRATION FRAUD



- Always check to make sure your Immigration Consultant has an 'active' status on ICCRC's website.
- Beware if you are encouraged to lie on your immigration application.
- Be alert if you see the ICCRC logo on an immigration website instead of the RCIC Insignia and there is no link to ICCRC's website to verify if the Immigration Consultant is registered with ICCRC.
- Be alert if you are guaranteed a job and immigration at the same time. Example: 'For \$10,000 we will find you a job and get your immigration papers.'
- If your Immigration Consultant is not listed on our website, they are not permitted to provide Canadian immigration advice for a fee.
- Beware if you are given guarantees on the processing times for your immigration application.
- 7 Make sure you receive invoices and receipts for all payments made to your Immigration Consultant.
- **8** Get directly in touch with the Immigration Consultant handling your application. Always use the contact information on our online public register.
- **9** Beware if you are not asked to sign a retainer agreement for immigration services.
- Be cautious if the person you want to hire for immigration services asks you for a CASH payment.
